



Biden on track to hit Covid-19 vaccination target

President Joe Biden promised to administer 100 million vaccines in his first 100 days in office. Since Dec. 14, the U.S. has delivered about 75.2 million vaccines and administered 63.1 million. As states ramp up vaccination efforts, Covid-19 cases are on a steady decline since peaking in early January.

VACCINATIONS PER DAY









Small states set the pace for vaccine rollout


With shipment delays caused by winter weather and vaccination website crashes, some states have dealt with more setbacks than others. While Utah has administered more than 90 percent of the doses delivered by the federal government, just 11 percent of its population has been vaccinated — one of the lowest rates in the country. On the other hand, the District of Columbia has one of the lowest rates of delivered doses that have been administered — 72.3 percent — yet more than 15 percent of residents have received as least one dose of a Covid-19 vaccine.

About 60 percent of the vaccine doses delivered to Puerto Rico have been administered, a rate lower than that of any U.S. state.
