


Fentanyl and methamphetamine use surges in the pandemic

Non-prescribed fentanyl and methamphetamine use increased significantly during the Covid-19 pandemic, according to a new report by specialty laboratory Millennium Health. Additionally, all U.S. census divisions saw jumps in positivity rates for at least one of the four drugs evaluated by the laboratory (fentanyl, methamphetamine, heroin and cocaine).






Fentanyl and methamphetamine use surges in the pandemic


