# U.S. infrastructure has improved since 2016 — but not by much

The condition of the nation's infrastructure has improved slightly, according to a quadrennial report issued by the American Society of Civil Engineers, which raised infrastructure's overall grade from a D, earned in 2017, to a C-minus.

Maintenance backlogs continue to persist in some sectors, but local, state and federal financing has improved. In November 2020, 98 percent of local infrastructure ballot initiatives passed. Since 2010, more than half of states have raised gasoline taxes to fund transportation projects.
