

House lawmakers' infrastructure earmark requests hit \$14.9B



The House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee has published data on members' funding requests for infrastructure development. Lawmakers have requested earmarks, known formally as Member Designated Projects, to be included in the committee's surface transportation legislation. The list of requests totals almost \$14.9 billion, in excess of the funding that will ultimately be available.
