



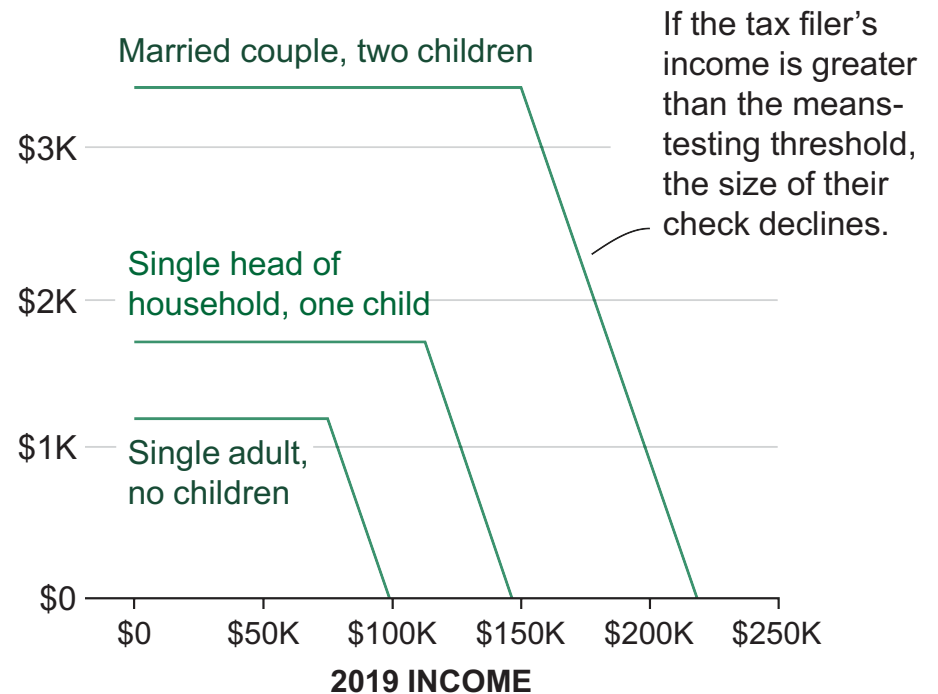
Who's getting a CARES Act stimulus check?

The CARES Act, the \$2 trillion pandemic relief package passed by Congress in late March, includes economic relief for individuals in the form of a \$1,200 stimulus check — or \$2,400 for a married couple — with a \$500 boost per child. But for individuals with 2019 incomes above \$75,000 and married couples with incomes above \$150,000, the amount is reduced by \$5 for every \$100 of income above the threshold. For unmarried heads of household, the threshold begins instead at \$112,500. Overall, according to estimates produced by the labor market analytics firm Emsi, 83 percent of workers are eligible for the full amount and an additional 8 percent are eligible for a partial amount.

For selected tax filer examples, by income



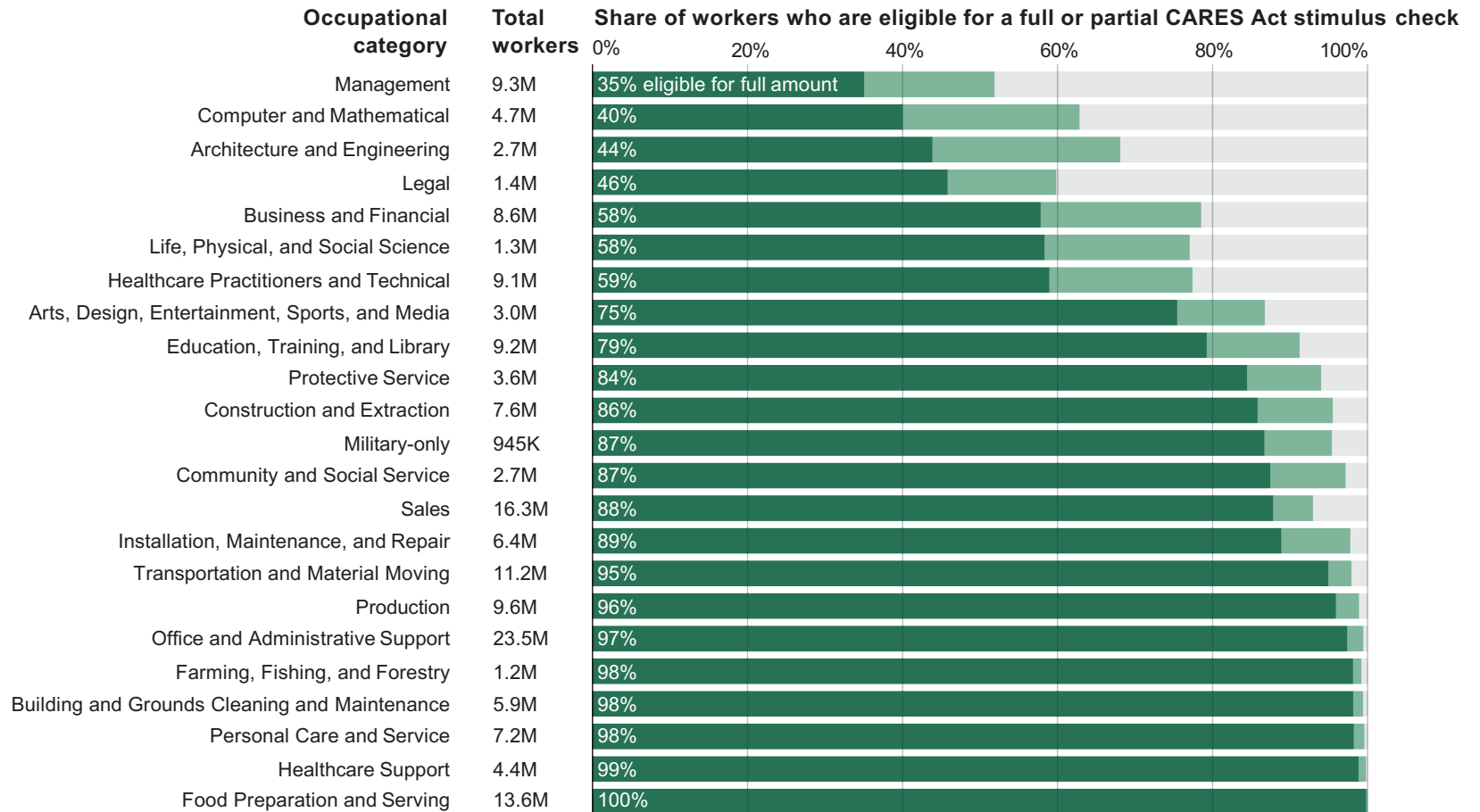

Which types of workers will be eligible for a stimulus check?



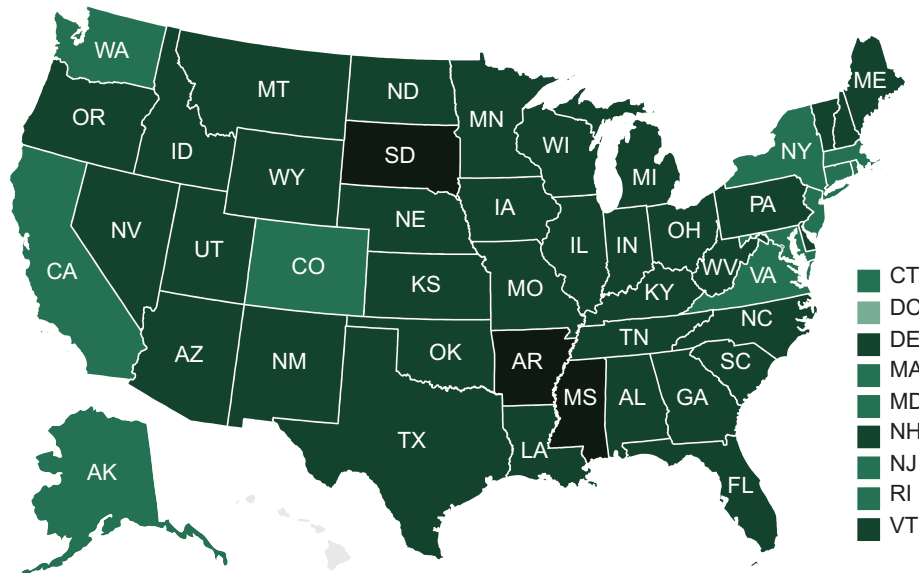
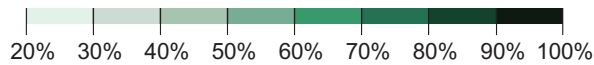

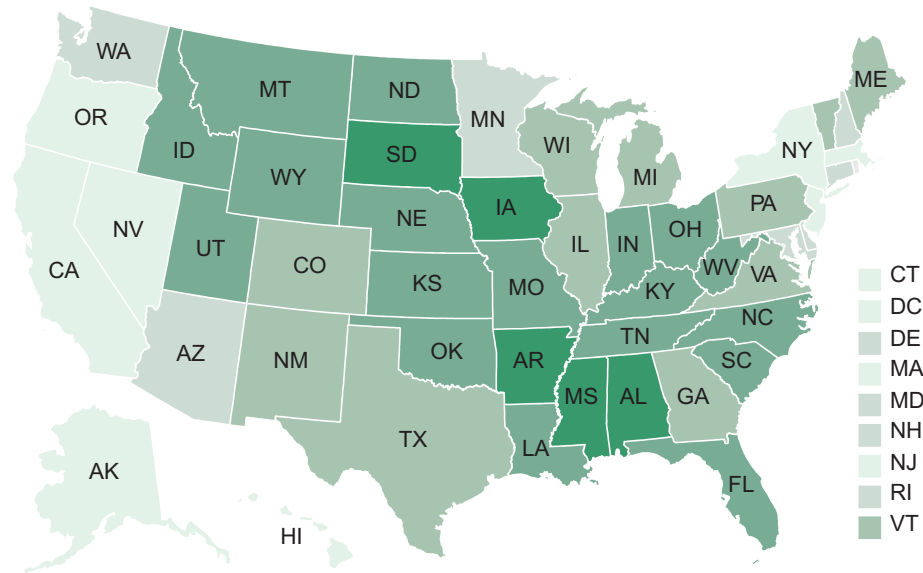
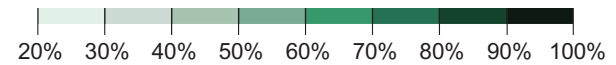
