

Vaccine tracker: 63.9% of U.S. adults have received first dose

63.9% of American adults have received at least one Covid-19 vaccine dose, according to CDC data as of the morning of June 9. More than 53% of adults have been fully vaccinated. Vaccination rates are higher for the 65-and-older group: 86.5% of older adults have received at least one dose, and nearly 76% are fully vaccinated. With vaccine demand slowing, the Biden administration has been making efforts to reach low-vaccinated communities, which are predominantly rural. And President Joe Biden last week announced a "month of action" — filled with extended pharmacy hours and new incentives — to get 70% of adults partially vaccinated by Independence Day.

In May, Biden said the U.S. would send 20 million vaccine doses from Pfizer, Moderna or Johnson & Johnson — in addition to the 60 million AstraZeneca doses previously promised — to countries in need by the end of June.
